Approximately 50 high schools participate each year, with senior football players, cheerleaders, band members, and student ambassadors ... many of whom are paired with a child (ages 4-18) with an intellectual disability. They are "buddies" from February to June, and enjoy monthly group activities that promote acceptance, inclusion, diversity, and understanding; frequent small group activities are also encouraged, to promote acceptance and inclusion with school and peer groups. DFRC also raises funds to support other programs throughout the state of Delaware that enrich the lives of Delawareans with intellectual disABILITIES.
